101st Black Hills Roundup PRCA Rodeo July 1-4th

Roundup opens its second century much like the first.

BELLE FOURCHE - The Black Hills Roundup 4th of July community celebration and rodeo is underway. Tonight, Wednesday, July 1st, will be the opening round of the PRCA rodeo, beginning at 7pm at the Roundup Grounds.

And as famous Yankee Manager Yogi Berra once said, "It's déjà vu all over again."

The roundup begins its second century this week much the same way it began its first century; in the middle of a global pandemic.

In 1918, the year of the first Roundup, the Spanish Flu had broken out and was making its way through the states as soldiers returned home from World War I. Organizers felt it important to still hold the event primarily as a Red Cross fundraiser tied to the war effort. Readers of local newspapers at the time were asked to cover their coughs, wash their hands and practice "good hygiene."

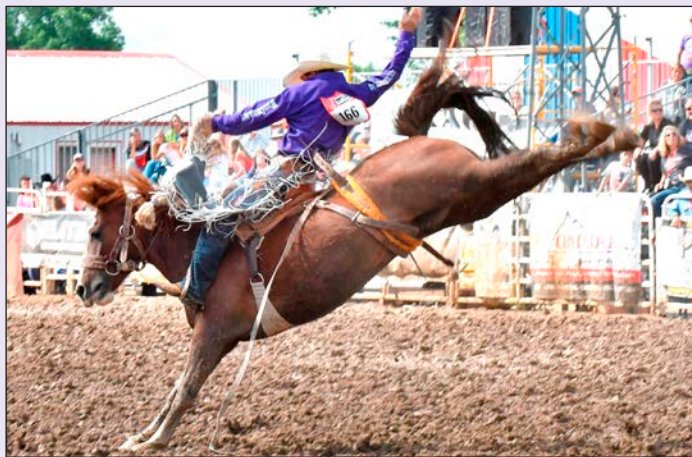
As the 2020 event unfolds behind the backdrop of the COVID-19 virus outbreak, the story sounds very familiar.

"Up until about 45 days ago we didn't know we were going to have the event for sure," said Keith Anderson, 2020 Roundup Committee Chairman. "It is amazing to me how quickly the community came together to organize things and get the 101st Roundup off the ground. I think the community needs something like this and we have things in place to keep folks safe while still allowing everyone to enjoy a great rodeo and celebrate the 4th of July."

Protocol for this year's event mirrors the 1918 event in several ways; practice good hygiene, wash your hands and be mindful of others. Would-be patrons to the 2020 event are encouraged to stay home if they are ill. Hand sanitizing stations are set up throughout the grounds, fans are encouraged to maintain physical distancing and if anyone feels uncomfortable after arriving they can immediately leave the arena and request a ticket refund. PRCA protocols are in place regarding contestants and rodeo workers.

Belle Fourche's Karen Wagner Voted Gaming Commission Chair

Wagner has served since 2016.

"Both Madam Chairman Wagner and Vice Chairman Fischer bring a wealth of

knowledge and experience to the Commission on Gaming," Commission on Gaming Executive Secretary Susan Christian said. "We are honored to have them continue their commitment to public service in these capacities."

First appointed in 2016 by Governor Dennis Daugaard and reappointed in 2019 by Governor Kristi Noem, Karen Wagner has served as the Commission on Gaming's Vice Madam Chairman for the past year. She is the owner and operator of a

communication with the Governor's office and local health officials as the event unfolds.

Even without a single case of COVID-19 in Butte County the virus has already had a side effect on the event. Because so many other rodeos have been cancelled the Roundup has been placed to the forefront of rodeo

events during a time period traditionally called "Cowboy Christmas." Normally over the 4th of July week there are dozens of rodeos occurring throughout the nation. This year, there may only be six, with the Roundup near the top of the list.

As a result the event has seen a record number of contestants who have entered. A total of 1,275 have signed up with a virtual who's who of current and past world champions and top-ten athletes. To put it simply, the event is at capacity.

"We've added a second day of slack and even with that we had to turn down hundreds more contestants who wanted to enter," Anderson said. "With all the top names entered it's very possible that we could see several world champions in the slack events."

The first slack was scheduled this morning with the second for Friday morning, July 3rd,

God's Simple Plan of Salvation

My Friend: I am asking you the most important question of life. Your joy or your sorrow for all eternity depends upon your answer. The question is: Are you saved? It is not a question of how good you are, nor if you are a church member, but are you saved? Are you sure you will go to Heaven when you die? God says in order to go to Heaven, you must be born again. In John 3:7, Jesus said to Nicodemus, **"Ye must be born again."**

In the Bible God gives us the plan of how to be born again which means to be saved. His plan is simple! You can be saved today. How?

First, my friend, you must realize you are a sinner. **"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).**

Because you are a sinner, you are condemned to death. **"For the wages [payment] of sin is death"** (Romans 6:23). This includes eternal separation from God in Hell.

"... it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27).

But God loved you so much He gave His only begotten Son, Jesus, to bear your sin and die in your place. **"... He hath made Him [Jesus, Who knew no sin] to be sin for us ... that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him"** (2 Corinthians 5:21).

Jesus had to shed His blood and die. **"For the life of the flesh is in the blood"** (Lev. 17:11). **"... without shedding of blood is no remission [pardon]"** (Hebrews 9:22).

"... God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8).

Although we cannot understand how, God said my sins and your sins were laid upon Jesus and He died in our place. He became our substitute. It is true. God cannot lie.

My friend, **"God ... commandeth all men everywhere to repent"** (Acts 17:30). This repentance is a change of mind that agrees with God that one is a sinner, and also agrees with what Jesus did for us on the Cross.

In Acts 16:30-31, the Philippian jailer asked Paul and Silas: **"... 'Sirs, what must I do to be saved?' And they said, 'Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved ...'"**

Simply believe on Him as the one who bore your sin, died in your place, was buried, and whom God resurrected. His resurrection powerfully assures that the believer can claim everlasting life when Jesus is received as Savior. **"But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name"** (John 1:12).

"For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." (Romans 10:13).

Whosoever includes you. Shall be saved means not maybe, nor can, but shall be saved.

Surely, you realize you are a sinner. Right now, wherever you are, repenting, lift your heart to God in prayer. In Luke 18:13, the sinner prayed: **"God be merciful to me a sinner."** Just pray: "Oh God, I know I am a sinner. I believe Jesus was my substitute when He died on the Cross. I believe His shed blood, death, burial, and resurrection were for me. I now receive Him as my Savior. I thank You for the forgiveness of my sins, the gift of salvation and everlasting life, because of Your merciful grace. Amen."

Just take God at His word and claim His salvation by faith. Believe, and you will be saved. No church, no lodge, no good works can save you. Remember, God does the saving. All of it!

God's simple plan of salvation is: You are a sinner. Therefore, unless you believe on Jesus Who died in your place, you will spend eternity in Hell. If you believe on Him as your crucified, buried, and risen Savior, you receive forgiveness for all of your sins and His gift of eternal salvation by faith.

You say, "Surely, it cannot be that simple." Yes, that simple! It is scriptural. It is God's plan. My friend, believe on Jesus and receive Him as Savior today.

If His plan is not perfectly clear, read this tract over and over, without laying it down, until you understand it. Your soul is worth more than all the world.

"For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?" (Mark 8:36).

Be sure you are saved. If you lose your soul, you miss Heaven and lose all. Please! Let God save you this very moment.

God's power will save you, keep you saved, and enable you to live a victorious Christian life. **"There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, Who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it"** (1 Corinthians 10:13).

Do not trust your feelings. They change. Stand on God's promises. They never change. After you are saved, there are three things to practice daily for spiritual growth:


Pray -- you talk to God.

Read your Bible -- God talks to you.

You should be baptized in obedience to the Lord Jesus Christ as a public testimony of your salvation, and then unite with a Bible-believing church without delay. **"Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord ..."** (2 Timothy 1:8)

"Whosoever therefore shall confess [testify of] Me before men, him will I confess also before My Father which is in heaven" (Matthew 10:32).

Pastor's Perspective

John 21-Down But Not Out

Although I have been in ministry as a pastor for almost 40 years, I cannot say I have "seen it all". But one thing that I have seen too often is people rejecting a relationship with God because of situations and circumstances that has happened to them while they are here. Others because they have believed what someone else told them about "the church". And it became an excuse not to commit to finding out who God really is and just dismissing Him.

I want to share a part of the gospel story with you about a man named Peter. He became a martyr for the cause of Christ, but he did not start out that way. As I share three things about him, I hope you can identify, and I pray it will encourage you to see God from a different light. 1] Failure – you will find there are times that you are going to fail – at something. Peter was a fisherman picked by Jesus Himself to become a disciple. He went on to do great things for the Lord, but perhaps the lowest part of his life was when he was told that he would deny Jesus before His death. Read Matthew 26:30-35; and 69-75. We want to stand tall and strong for the Lord, but the truth is that we will never know what we will do until the time comes. Matthew 26 ends with Peter alone and weeping because of his failure. 2] Restoration – you may give up on you, but God never does! Jesus was not at that sea-shore by accident. He came not only to encourage His disciples, but he came to let Peter know that

although this incident was big in his mind, failure is only permanent when we give up. Peter was so excited to see Jesus again that he beat the others to the shore. Why? There was always hope inside of him that said, "Are you here for me? "Am I redeemable in your eyes?" Jesus' answer was this: "Do you love Me? Get back to My business!" 3] Enabled – when God gives us something to do, He also empowers or enables us to do it. Peter denied even knowing Jesus, in front of everyone, and yet Jesus comes back to recommitment him, so to speak, to encourage him not to give up but to continue in this relationship and ministry. After he receives the promised Holy Spirit [that is another story], Peter stands before the people of Jerusalem [Acts 2] and shares the story and ministry of Jesus and about 3,000 people respond to the goodness of God!

My encouragement to you – what Jesus said to Peter, I believe He says to you and me today. "It does not matter what others are doing, to you I say, "You follow Me". There are many voices out there, calling out to follow them, because they have the truth. What we must decide is whether we will follow man, or we will follow God. God has nothing but good things for you [Jeremiah 29:11] and He wants to help you and bless you and strengthen you all the days of your life. If you will let Him. It is your choice.

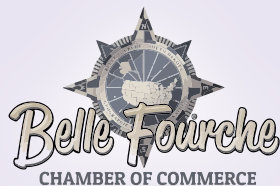


Independence Day 2020

On July 4, 1776, the colonists claimed their independence from England, an event which eventually led to the formation of the United States. Each year on the fourth of July, also known as Independence Day, Americans celebrate this historic event. Independence, however, was not secured until September 3, 1783 when the Treaty of Paris was signed, bringing the Revolutionary War to its conclusion.

In the War of 1812, independence was reaffirmed when the United States defeated Britain once again. After these conflicts, a spirit of nationalism and expansion swept the country over the following two decades. Americans headed west in droves. It was newspaper editor, John O'Sullivan, who coined the term, "Manifest Destiny" in 1845 to describe the fervor fueling the westward expansion.

It was during this time, in the mid-1800s, that the railroads were built, reaching further and further west. Cowboys played a significant role in the westward expansion. They herded



and rounded up livestock for transport by rail from locations like Belle Fourche to the rest of the country. It was out of this culture, the Black Hills Roundup was founded when 15,000 people gathered in a Belle Fourche field to help raise funds for the 1918 war.

The 101st Black Hills Roundup and all the events in and around it this year are going to be just that – a tremendous celebration of our history, our community's strong spirit of independence and a desire to make a positive impact in our world. Events like the Chutes for Charity Golf Tournament which raises funds to help our local community, The Cowboy Breakfast downtown put on by our local Lions Club, the FFA Burger Bash, which raises funds to help our youth, and Tough Enough to Wear Pink Night at the Rodeo, demonstrate our community's commitment to helping one

another.

It goes without saying, we have a lot to be thankful for in Belle Fourche. By the time you read this article, our town will be buzzing with traffic and people. Our local businesses need this traffic and commerce to help recover from the downturn due to COVID-19. Let us ALL extend a cordial, safe and warm welcome to our visitors as they attend events and patronize our local businesses.

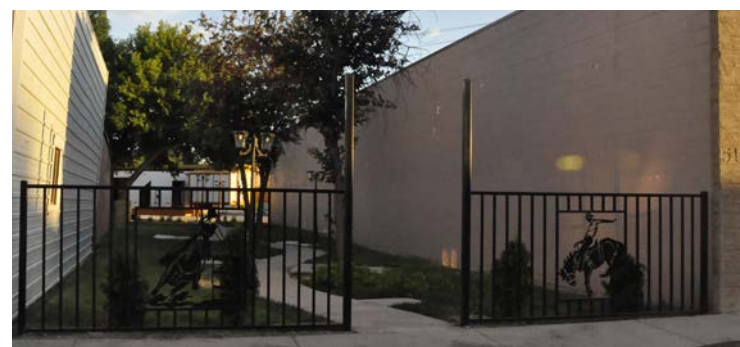

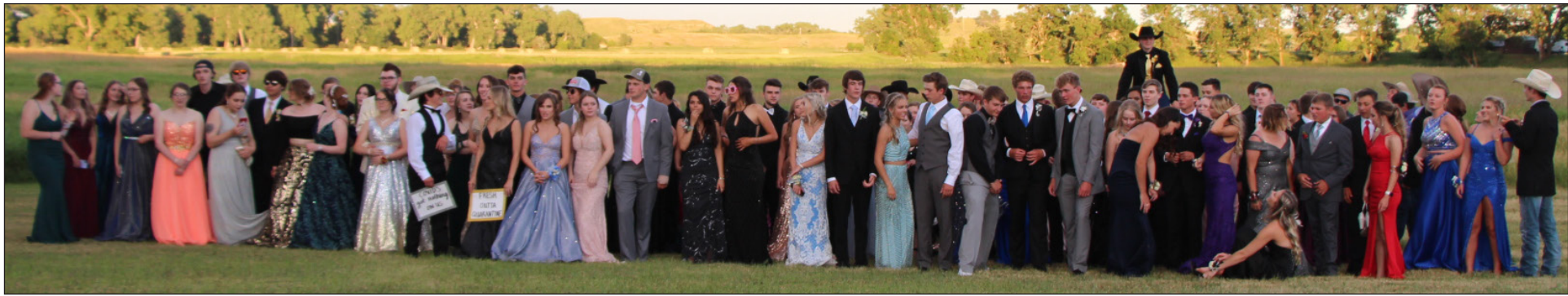

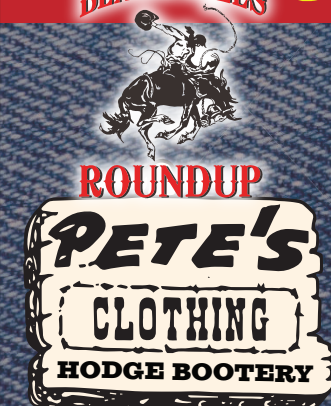

beginning at 8am and running through 2pm for all timed events. Steer roping competition will be held on Thursday morning, July 2nd, at 10am.

During the committee's final meeting last week before the event Anderson thanked the volunteers and committee chairpersons for their diligence, ingenuity and hard work to make sure the event was held uninterrupted.

Mayor Gloria Landphere and Alderman Randy Schmidt were also present at the meeting. "I just wanted to wish you all kinds of luck with the event. I know you've all worked hard and the volunteers have done a great job," the Mayor said, addressing the Committee and volunteers last Thursday. "The city of Belle Fourche really

appreciates all of you."

This year's roundup has also attracted the attention of the Pro Rodeo Cowboy Association front office. A large contingent from Colorado Springs, including CEO George Taylor, will spend several days in Belle Fourche to take in the event. Also present will be nearly the entire Cheyenne Frontier Days rodeo committee. Frontier Days was cancelled for the first time in its 124-year old history late last month due to coronavirus concerns.

"We're really honored to host the PRCA front office with Mr. Taylor and all those from the Frontier Days who are coming up," Anderson said. "We welcome you and all our visitors."

As a side note, due to the many rodeo cancellations, a record number of vendors will

be set up at the rodeo grounds, many have come up from Cheyenne. Terry Siegfried, who oversees vendor participation in the Roundup, says there could be as many as 25 set up behind the grandstands area.

"We have a little bit of everything this year," he said. "It's about 4 times more than we had last year. And we want to encourage folks to come out and see what we've got."

Also this year, the Roundup will be live streamed on the Cowboy Channel. Working with local media company Western Sky Media, they plan to bring all four rounds to the viewing public. The Roundup will be featured alongside a live broadcast of the Prescott Arizona PRCA tour event during the same general timeframe. It marks the first time the network has featured the Belle Fourche rodeo in a live broadcast.

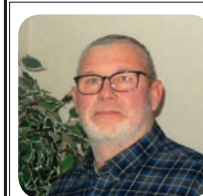

Imagination Marketing

Robert Rose once said, “Marketing is telling the world you are a rock star. Content marketing is showing the world you are one.” Too often, when we think of marketing our communities and businesses, we tend to think how to reach as many sets of eyes as possible. Certainly, reaching eyes is critical to the overall marketing and branding mix, but if that is the extent and main focus of your marketing efforts, you are missing the boat entirely and will ultimately fail.

Humans have several senses that tend to be overlooked when preparing your marketing or branding strategies. Yes, the eyes are an important one. But let’s not ignore the senses of touch, smell, taste and hearing. Let’s face it, many of those other senses are every bit, if not more powerful than the eyes. Think of the music you grew up with, think of the music that accompanies the Olympics, both conjure up powerful visuals in your mind.

When you walk into a restaurant, is it the words on the menu that capture your mind or is it the smell of fresh coffee or bread, seafood, steak that ultimately wins the day. When you walk into a potential new home, is it the address and look of the property? Or, is it the combination of that along with the feelings of home, the smells of freshly baked cookies on the counter or the image of what it would be like living there that ultimately sells the property?

When enjoying music, is it the words of the song that first captures your attention? Or is it the beat and rhythm that suck you in? Is it the words on the window of a new car that capture you, or is it the smell of the newness or the feel of the vehicle when you take a test-drive?

But greater than all of the above examples and the words or images the eyes behold, are the unrecognized sense we often over-look, the sense of imagination. The best way to sell your ideas, your community, and your business is through imagination marketing.

What is imagination marketing? Very simply put, it is marketing in such a way the audience is imagining themselves in your product, your business or your community.

Some of the greatest marketing campaigns of all time evolve around this concept of imagination or content marketing. Whether you could be just like the Marlboro Man years ago, jump like Michael Jordan by buying his branded shoes, being an Indy driver by buying a certain car, losing weight with this or that product, experiencing that burger that makes your mouth water by looking at the commercial, hearing the Coke sizzle on the screen causing you to get up and buy a \$6.00 cup of Coke, it all evolved around getting you to believe you would gain a particular strength or passion by simply buying the product.

What does this mean to a business or community today? Communities need to sell vision and imagination. They need not only sell their events and attractions, they need to convince readers, viewers and listeners that they have to do more than just see it, they must experience it and imagine it. If you believe your town is musical, visitors must hear, see and experience music at every turn. If your town promotes itself as a BBQ capital, then promote the imagination of BBQ on everyone’s taste buds 24/7. If you believe your town is a renaissance town, then embrace it and become renaissance in

nature. Whatever the hook, be a big hook capable of catching large fish, not a hook seeking minnows.

Marketing and branding are vastly different. While different, both are effectively an art based largely on localized intuition, coupled with good information and data. When it comes to marketing and branding your community or business, everyone will offer their two-cents, but understand the true value of those two-cents. Don’t just tell the world what you are; show the world what you are. That is the essence of imagination and content marketing.

Lady Of The Manor

The nursing home plants color with seasonal displays, celebration balloons, tulips and deciduous trees in the small courtyard. Brightly-painted plastic birds suspended from sapling aspen sway in aimless flight.

She leans stiffly into her mirror, colors her days with foundation a bit too heavy, her blush a shade bright, her lipstick a shaky line. Arthritic hands pat new-perm curls into place, and labored fingers loop a paisley scarf to soft folds of camouflage beneath her thinning face.

She moves slowly through the halls, speaking to everyone, smiling and touching and caring. Her walk is measured, swollen ankles push against black leather straps, stolid under support hose and knobby knees.

She breathes deep, of pungent sage and Ponderosa pine, pulls a hand through dusky soil, feels a breeze lift her hair.

Outside her window the bright birds cling to the bare bones of twilight, a covey of charlatans moving to a rhythm only she can hear.

Pendleton Roundup Canceled

For only the third time in the iconic history and tradition of the Pendleton Round-Up, the 110th Pendleton Round-Up and the 104th Happy Canyon Indian

Pageant & Wild West Show and associated events will not be held the second full week in September 2020.

A statement from the committee read as follows: "We are disappointed to announce that current health and safety restrictions preclude us from hosting the Pendleton Round-Up and Happy Canyon in our traditional way this September. Round-Up and Happy Canyon have been a celebration of community and a catalyst to support education, local not for profits, service organizations, and provide direct benefits to the regional economy. It is disheartening the events will not take place in 2020 for all involved."

Beginning last March and on a weekly basis, members of the Pendleton Round-Up and Happy Canyon Boards and staff began meeting with local, state and various association representatives to begin the process of discussing the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and how the event could go on in a traditional and full manner. According to a committee spokesperson they remained optimistic that the event may have the possibility of moving forward.

"The focus of the effort was to pursue a pathway forward to preserve the benefits and involvement of the entire community and region by hosting the event in the full traditional and historic manner," the statement read. "A comprehensive operational plan was submitted to the (Oregon) governor's office to implement various safety protocols in order to host our guests whom attend and participate in the various community events. This comprehensive plan detailed our precautions that would allow the event to proceed as normally planned and traditionally produced, if approved by state officials."

"As it has become evident that the events would not be allowed under the current restrictions, the Pendleton Round-Up and Happy Canyon Board of Direc-

tors believe that the best course is to not host the events for 2020. This difficult decision is in the best interest for the health and safety of the community, volunteers, tribal participants, vendors, sponsors and contestants. Not having an event in 2020 will have an impact on our entire community, region, local businesses, supporters, sponsors and loyal fans."

PRCA Hall of Fame Back Open Again

The ProRodeo Hall of Fame and Museum of the American Cowboy reopened its doors to visitors Monday, June 22, ninety-one days after closing due to the coronavirus lockdown. The museum will adhere to the health and safety guidelines approved by the El Paso County Public Health Department including social distancing guidelines, cleaning guidelines, safety policies, etc.

"We are beyond thrilled to make this announcement," said Hall of Fame Director Kent Sturman. "It has been a long time coming. We are looking forward to welcoming the public back to our museum. The health and safety of our staff, visitors and attendees is our priority. We have adopted two dozen policies and procedures to ensure that we will reopen the museum in the safest way possible."

The approved safety plan is available on the Hall of Fame's website and at the admissions desk in the museum.

Water fountains, touch screens and the Little Champions Arena will remain closed and off limits due to health department guidelines. The museum will not open the livestock exhibit this summer since it is already so late in the season. All other areas of the museum will be open to the public.

The Hall of Fame will open seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and will extend those hours through Sept. 30.

Then and Now in Newell

July 7, 1910

Newell is situated in direct proximity to Deadwood, Lead and other Black Hills mining towns where thousands of men employed, making a constant demand for everything this county will produce and in addition to these markets, we are on a direct line of railroads between this section and the larger eastern cities, as Omaha, Sioux City, Chicago, Minneapolis and St. Paul.

On Tuesday evening a mass meeting was called for the purpose of conferring with the USRS engineers; R.F. Walters, O.N. McDermott and Mr. Adams, the engineers in charge of the platting of the Townsite. Mr. Walters, the chief engineer was favorably impressed with the plan outlined by the meeting and gave assurance that the plan would be accepted. He also said the work of platting the Townsite would be completed as soon as possible and thought perhaps the Town Lot Sale would be held about September 15.

July 1, 1920

The Newell hospital, designated as a government hospital, was established in 1913. It has 4 rooms and sun parlor, is equipped with electric lights, x-ray and electric fans. A complete hospital force is maintained. In 1919 there were

34 babies born in this hospital. Dr. Clark, who is in constant attendance, held the county record for the number of confinement cases for the past year. Dr. Clark is designated Government physician for Newell.

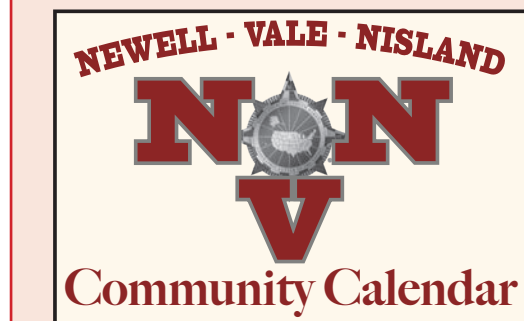

NEWELL – It's been a while since there has been enough going on around the NVN area to combine bits of info and news to create a weekly Roundup, but finally people are starting to see things open up and are beginning to get out and about.

Newell students aren't just vegging this summer, but several were found with Kyle Sanderson, Newell High School cross country coach, running around the streets of town, keeping in shape for the fall season that they hope to see when they return to school.

As a result of the recent construction activity at the Willow Creek Windfarm project northeast of Newell, the R-n-R campground has seen an increase in business as several of the construction workers for the site are renting camping spots at

the location on the south edge of town.

A recent wind storm did a major amount of damage at the Five F feedlot north of Nisland, downing two long sheds on the hill above the southern yards and a shorter shed on the south side of the hill that were tossed into bits.

The business has not yet been able to clean up the debris and has not started any repairs but will need to do so before fall when cattle start arriving.

212-79 Service station in Newell is getting a facelift with all new concrete in the front of the building. Firefly construction of Belle Fourche is the contractor. They have been working in segments to keep the business open and a lane to

the gas pumps available. The service center is also currently looking for a mechanic to work

in the shop area.

Owl Creek hill, east of the 212-79 junction south of Newell will soon be impassable for any vehicle over 11 feet wide. Martin Construction out of North Dakota is creating two bypass roads

over the creek for traffic to use while the bridge is being worked on by the SD DOT. The bypass roads are being constructed with large culverts which will bypass the main waterflow under the bridge and will not be capable of handling the wider loads. So beware, and check before you try to take something over the road toward Belle Fourche.

The Newell city election had a small turnout, even with six candidates vying for two positions on the commission. Linda Vollmer, Marge Adams and Margie LaDuke manned the election table at city hall. Precautions for physical distancing were in place with a sign on the door, another at the entrance to the hall and barriers in place. Voting stations were spaced a good way apart to provide for the six-foot distance required.

"There were about 30 absentee ballots from April," said Vollmer, referring to when the election was originally supposed to take place on April 14. Early morning traffic was better and then it tapered off toward lunchtime.

of the withdrawn areas adjacent to the southeast shore of the Belle Fourche Reservoir. This area is to be developed by the club as recreational grounds to which the public will have free access. Water for irrigation of the trees and grounds is to be available only when not needed on the irrigatable lands of the project.

July 4, 1940

Some boys find pleasure in shooting and killing birds, but 3 Newell boys were found to be active conservationists here last week when they were discovered trying to save the life of a song bird. The boys; Carl Partridge, Jimmy Dale Milberg and Bobby Conner, had rescued the bird from an oil barrel, into which it had apparently fallen, behind the Newell Implement Company building and after cleaning and drying it one of the boys took it home for further care.

In the interest of clerks in local stores and the general public in maintaining uniform business hours in Newell, the Community Club in regular meeting last Friday went on record as "publicly disapproving" Sunday and evenings (except Saturday) merchandising hours in this city. It was pointed out that keeping uniform closing hours in all business firms in this city

would provide better service to the many people in the large trading area and that public support should be enlisted in this move.

July 6, 1950

Lightning apparently killed Ellas Leehuga, 36, farm hand from Pharr, Texas near Newell last Friday around 3:45. Leehuga was working on the Glen Sherbon farm 5 miles west of town, was apparently struck on the top of the head during an electrical storm. A spot of hair about the size of a man's head was singed by the bolt. Leehuga's body was discovered by Sherbon when he went to see how the man was progressing with irrigating. He was found stretched full length, an irrigating shovel cross his body. Sheriff Elmer Conner, Deputy Maurice Cavin and Coroner J.H. Krenier investigated the accident. It is reported that he had died either directly from that or from a resulting heart attach. He was wearing rubber boots, but his body and clothing were wet from the rain. He leaves a wife and 5 children. His body has been shipped to Pharr, Texas for burial.

July 7, 1960

For this year, the club voted to buy 10 Brahma calves and 5 or more sale ring calves, the former being secured at \$75 per head and to be brought to Newell this week. Annual membership fee would be \$5 and the usual \$10 initiation fee would be required of all new members. It was also decided that non-members could rope calves if invited by a member who would be responsible for a 50 cents per calf roping fee to be charged. The next meeting will be held July 12 at Evert's Place at 8:00 PM, with invitation to everyone interested urged to attend.

Cliff and Vicki were renting it from Dad. Cliff had a backhoe and trenching machine, but Vicki wanted something to do to make some extra income. So they had fixed up some of the old buildings and pens and were raising some hogs. Vicki did a lot of the work, but Cliff helped in the evenings and on weekends.

When I came along, they were in the process of trying to get a big old sow up the hill to a building where they kept the sows when they were due to have baby pigs. I don't remember if this pig had been there and had escaped or was going to have pigs in a week or so and needed to be put in the pigging house. Probably the former by the way things went. Vicki and Cliff weren't having any luck getting this ol' sow moved and evidently tempers had flared. Neither Cliff or Vicki seemed to be in too good of a mood! Cliff looked up and saw me and Yeller and hollered to, "get the hell over here and drag this damn sow up to the pig house!"

I should mention right here that ol' Yeller didn't like pigs. He hated them and everything about them! Along with small children, sheep and any

other thing he could think of to spook at. He was just a little snorty! But Cliff didn't seem to care about Yellers feelings about pigs or anything else!

Somehow we got a rope onto the pig around her neck, so that it wouldn't come off and I dallied up and away we went. If a sow is skinny enough and someone is mad enough, it is possible to keep a rope on one, around their neck! Don't remember a lot about the trip, but I do remember that it was fast and short. We got this pig drug up to the door of the building and she went in somehow or other. I remember that I was a little worried that me and Yeller might go into the building, as Yeller was watching behind him more than he was in front! I thought he might be scared enough of the hog to go right in the door and it was a real little door! A walk thru', the size of an ordinary house door and I don't think we would have fit very good. But he didn't.

I think the pig had her babies and they were all healthy and strong. Didn't seem like the trip hurt the ol' sow at all. So while I can't claim to be a good hog roper, me an ol' Yeller was pretty fair hog draggers!

Because of the recent events with the Covid, and beef packing plants running behind, there has been a big surge for people to buy beef from local farmers and ranchers and have

it processed locally. It's a great idea and one many have done for years. Of course, when you do that, you need a fair amount of freezer space to keep all the nice fresh beef in.

There have been several pages started on Facebook and others, to get local beef producers together with the customer. Working pretty good it looks like, but many of these, first time large amounts of beef buyers, are learning lessons many of us have taken for granted for years. Such as shrink.

When you butcher a beef, pig or sheep, you do not get to keep all the weight of the live animal. And when you hang it up, it loses some moisture in the meat. This is known as shrink. So many don't realize they are not getting as much meat as they had planned on. No, no one is cheating them, it is all just the way it works. I suppose unscrupulous people might inject water into the meat to make it weigh more, but no honest rancher or farmer or person who works or runs one of the local butcher shops would do that. People would soon find out and they would be out of business... and I like to think those around here are more honest and morally upright, than that, anyway.

As different individuals sell their beef, pork or lamb, they price it differently.

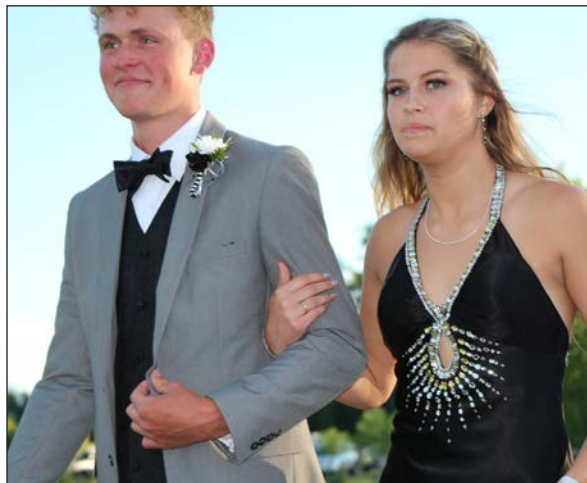

Each seller has their reasons for what they do. I haven't noticed any trying to get rich selling meat. They would just like to make a fair price.

Those who are willing to sell burger for \$3 a pound, I say fine, do so. I can't afford to sell mine for that, unless I want

to lose money on the critter that was butchered. And I remember back in 1973 when Nixon put the price freeze on and people quit selling their fat cattle as they didn't think were getting enough. Then they took the price freeze off and all those over fed animals hit the market.. cattle prices plummeted. But that is another story.. what I remember was that burger got to \$3 a pound. In 1973. How many years ago is that? And people thought it was too high! Housewives picketed grocery stores!

I remember buying a brand new 4 wheel drive pickup, a half ton Chevy in the spring or 1978 and they had it priced at \$7,400. So when you consider that a pickup like that today would probably be priced at \$35,000 or better today, seems to me like \$3 a pound hamburger is awful cheap.

I watched fat butcher cows sell for 59 cents a pound at a local sale barn yesterday. My son was happy that they brought that much. And considering what they were selling for a few months ago, I guess they
