### Albany Farms Moves in; Transformation of Permian Tank Plant Begins

BELLE FOURCHE – The news of Los Angeles-based food manufacturer Albany Farms moving to Belle Fourche made national headlines this past week. Albany Farms announced it will be creating a large production complex at the Belle Fourche Industrial and Rail Park that will eventually produce more than 100 million units of its Twisted Noodle ramen product, boxed macaroni and cheese and Albany Farms packaged flour.

National media such as US News and World Report and USA Today, national food service trade publications and local media outlets throughout the Midwest carried the news that is projected to bring hundreds of jobs to the community within the next four years.

"Our goal is to be the largest, if not one of the largest, ramen producing facilities in the country," Bill Saller, President and CEO of Albany Farms told the Beacon. "We plan to employ up to 900 workers once were to scale, but that will depend on the support we get from the local, state and the federal level."

Saller said that kind of support was virtually non-existent in California which led to the company looking to relocate. "It's such a large economy there that it's difficult for us to gain the support that we need to launch," he said. "We're segue-waying from primarily importing to all-US production. There's a significant amount of work and finance that goes into that. So having a partnership with local and state-level officials to gain the awareness of loans and other sorts of support that enable us, from a financial perspective to move forward, is critical. And we just weren't

# Covid Well Under Control in BF Schools; Graduation Rate Hits 99%

Critical Race Theory will not be taught anytime soon.

BELLE FOURCHE – The cases of COVID within the Belle Fourche School District are very well managed according to Dr. Steve Willard, Superintendent. Willard gave the assessment at the annual school board retreat, a special meeting held on Monday, Oct. 25th.

"COVID numbers are pretty

much non-existent," Willard told the board. "Our sanitizing the buses, having hand sanitizers in the school and the hygiene everyone is doing has really helped. I'm really happy with how Brandi (VanSickle, school nurse) is taking care of our children. She's getting the word out about our two free

COVID tests."
Willard says they are now looking toward their next health issue, a more familiar one.

"Now we'll get ready for the flu, which will be the next thing that comes our way every year," Willard said.

Willard also gave the board a report about the most recent meeting of the South Dakota Board of Educational Standards. The board held the first of four hearings on improving the educational standards in seven curricular areas. There were some changes proposed to CTE courses, agricultural courses and business.

The area which received the most attention was social studies curriculum. The teaching of critical race theory has been a hot button issue nationwide in public schools and last spring the state's Joint Commission on Appropriations informed state education bureaucrats that they should refrain from applying for federal grants to teach such courses until after the legislature can review the topic in its next session.

"The Department of Ed, with the direction of the governor will begin taking applications beginning November 1st to be on a new review commission," Willard said. "There will be about 30 to 40 people on the commission, and they will review social studies standards including studies related to indigenous people within the state."

The committee will be formed in late November or December, according to Willard. They will have facilities training early next year and begin the review in March.

"Hopefully by next year at this time they'll be up for review by the Board of Ed," Willard said. "I'm pretty sure we'll be hearing a lot about this in the news."

The district has reached a 99% graduation and completion rate, according to Angela Reder, District-wide Curriculum Director and Testing Coordinator. She reported to the board that the state-wide average is 90%.

"I think we have one of the highest rates in the state," she said. "It is well above the state average. It is a really strong area in our school district."

Reder also informed the board that the latest district report card has been released to the public. However, due to distance-learning brought on by COVID the report has some missing data from the 2019-2020 school year.

"Schools are assigned a
School Performance Index
based on the indicators that they
assess," Reder said. "Overall
our score did dip a little bit
when compared to 2018-19
but we had a large number of
distance learners which did
have an effect on our scores.
But overall I was pleasantly
surprised."

Reder said the scores at South Park held very steady which is remarkable as children at the younger grade levels have generally struggled more with the technology and process needed to complete distance learning.

Financially the district is on good footing. This past year saw a large influx of funds related to COVID relief and that has been a temporary help. Susan Proefrock, Business

BELLE FOURCHE – In the absence of President Cris Miller, Vice-President Dan Marrs took the lead at the 81st annual meeting of the Butte Electric on Tuesday, October 26 at the Belle Fourche Area Recreation Center.

After last year's no-dinner event, this year it was back to the dinner table, with a complete meal catered by Rent a Chef's Kent and Sue Burnison of Spearfish. The meal was enjoyed by around 400 people scattered over the floor of the sports area. Following the meal of roast beef and roast pork, the crowd entered the theater for the meeting portion of the evening.

Elections were held. In District 1 the candidates were Travis Schenk and Paul Slavec. Schenk, was the successful candidate. In District II incumbent Tom Brunner ran against Stan Smith. Brunner maintained his seat on the board. Paul Winkler ran unopposed for the open District III seat.

A fond farewell was said to Tom Casteel who

has served the coop for the past 45 years as a District III director. "We went from 'Willy Wirehand' (icon) to 'Touchstone Energy' during my time on the board," said Casteel. "We added the new facility in Newell and the two outposts in Sturgis and Spearfish. Casteel was recognized with a standing ovation from the other members in attendance.

Public Utilities Commissioner Chris Nelson was the keynote speaker. He told those gathered that there are three things they need to remember about the path the rural electric company has traveled through the years. "They are self-reliant, they give great customer service and they do things in a hard environment," he shared. "This is an electric energy revolution to reduce emissions and become more carbon free. South Dakota is leading the way and is currently 83 percent carbon free. We need to keep the lights and the heat on for the state of South Dakota."





# Bronc Volleyball Closes Out Regular Season with a Record of 25-8

The Belle Fourche Lady Broncs traveled to Hill City last Tuesday night. Despite a dominating first set, the Broncs lost the next three to give Hill City a tally in their win column.

The first play of the game Kaylin Garza denied Hill City's outside hitter at the net to earn the first point and set the tone for set 1. Tied at 3-3, the Broncs won the point for 4 of the next 5 balls. Mataya Ward snuck a ball between the double block for a kill and Garza took advantage of a Ranger overpass for a kill. Ward solo blocked the right side and a play later did so again with the assistance of Garza. Grace Clooten earned a block to send the score to 11-6 and the Broncs finished the set on top 25-17.

The second set was a battle point for point. Dylan Stedillie earned a kill from the right side to put the Broncs ahead 11-10. Tied again at 14-14, Ward put a ball away in front of Hill City's Libero. The efforts of the Broncs weren't quite enough and Hill City took the second set 25-18.

The third set started out close at 4-4 when Mckenzie Lyons saved a dig that was bit tight to the net by pushing it over the net for the point. Hill City then utilized strong spot-serving to fluster the Broncs and hinder their offense for the rest of the set to win 25-16. Despite Stedillie's ace in the very beginning of set four and a block by Clooten at 16-18 to put the Broncs within 1 point, the Rangers secured the win of set four 25-19 and the match 3-1.

Garza and Ward each had 10 kills for the Broncs and Lily McCarty had 15 assists. Stedillie had 18 digs, followed closely by Chloe Crago with 15 and Ward with 14. For the Rangers, three hitters had 9 kills a piece and five of the Rangers were in double digits for digs.

The Broncs celebrated Senior Night Thursday night as they defeated Lead-Deadwood in a clean sweep of sets with scores 25-8, 25-8, and 25-14. All four seniors, Kaylin Garza, Terlin Cazer, McKenzie Lyons, and Allison Labrier, were among the starting lineup. The Broncs went 8-0 for the start of set one

when Dylan Stedillie threw the ball down on the Digger's side of the net to continue the run. A few plays later, Adryana Hovland got a block and Garza put back a Lead-Deadwood overpass. Near the end of the set Garza got a couple aces and the Broncs decidedly secured the first set win.

Hovland got a kill and Tia Williamson earned an ace to score the first two points of set two. The Broncs kept their momentum throughout the set and Stedillie earned another kill from the right side to round it out. The Diggers sparked alive in set three leading the Broncs 8-6 when Grace Clooten blocked the opposing middle hitter. # Anything Left in the Barrel?

Was driving across Minnesota on the way to granddaughter's wedding in Michigan when I saw a sign that said "Lakefield". I said to my

wife, "Isn't that an oxymoron?" Lake & Field?

English Lesson: An oxymoron is a figure of speech: a creative approach to language that plays with meaning and the use of words in a non-literal sense. This literary device combines words with contradictory definitions to coin a new word or phrase. The incongruity of the resulting statement allows writers to play with language and meaning.

Before I'm "clearly misunderstood" let me explain.

Oxymorons are oppositional words joined to create a unique word or phrase. An oxymoron can seem absurd yet make perfect sense at the same time. For example, the phrase "virtual reality" is formed from contrasting words. The word "oxymoron" is an oxymoron itself, derived from the Greek words "oxys" (meaning "sharp") and "moros" (meaning "dull").

Although we accept words or comments that are an oxymoron without giving them a thought, but how can you be a Lake and a Field?

Here are some "awfully good" examples I'm sure you've heard that may bring back "bittersweet' memories of a time when you were "alone together":

You may wish to give "even odds" that an "exact estimate" of the number of oxymoron examples we all use is "old news" but reading on isn't your "only choice".

"Good grief" don't mistake any of these as a "genuine imitation' but consider it a "minor miracle" that any "wise fool" may have these as a part of their vocabu-

Examples: cheerful pessimist, civil war, clearly misunderstood, conspicuous absence, cool passion, crash landing, cruel kindness, deafening silence, deceptively honest, definite maybe, deliberate speed, devout atheist, dull roar, eloquent silence, extinct life, falsely true (Tennyson 1862), festive tranquility, found missing, freezer burn, friendly takeover, and guest host.

The list is "growing smaller" but continuing on: historical present, humane slaughter, icy hot, ill health, jumbo shrimp,

larger half, lascivious grace (Shakespeare 1609), lead balloon, liquid marble (Jonson 1601), living dead, living end, living sacrifices, loosely sealed, loud whisper, loyal opposition,

magic realism, militant pacifist, negative growth, negative income, open secret, original copy, paper tablecloth, and paper towel.

Gathering this list at the onset seemed an "impossible solution", but with a mixture of "intense apathy" and "joyful sadness" as any "wise fool" we will get to the

It might be considered "melancholy merriment" but this " one-man band" instead of being "openly deceptive" or "overbearingly modest" will bring this to the "opening conclusion".

A peaceful conquest, plastic glasses, plastic silverware, poor health, pretty ugly, properly ridiculous, random order, recorded live, resident alien, same difference, scalding coolness (Hemingway 1940), seriously funny, shrewd dumbness, soft rock, "The Sound of Silence" (Simon 1965), static flow, steel wool, student teacher, "sweet sorrow" (Shakespeare 1595), terribly good, theoretical experience, transparent night (Whitman 1865), true fiction, unconscious awareness, upward fall, and working vacation.








# Mick B. Harrison's Artists License ...and other wonderments.

# **Ask The Motor Medics®**

From the Hosts of the Under The Hood® radio show.

Dear Motor Medics,

I live in an area where we have winter road conditions and see many cars that end up either spun out or in the ditch and some that rear end others. The question I pose to you is about stopping and handling. Recently I started paying close attention to

the types of vehicles that were involved in these incidents and I noticed that almost all of them were noticeably older than the ones that had not been involved in the mishaps. Is there a connection between age and lack of control or is it just a coincidence?

**Dale in Des Moines Iowa** 

There's a connection between age and control. Many things contribute to how a vehicle stops. When tires are new the tread is deeper, so they shed water and cut through snow better and maintain a firmer grip on the road. A tire that is older with half its tread will have a much greater stopping distance. Also, suspension plays a big part. Most people don't replace shocks and struts unless they are bouncy but before you feel the extra bounce, they will start to lose their ability to keep the tires in contact with the road as they once did. Many newer vehicles also have elaborated electronic stability control systems. The best way to be sure your car is performing at its best ability is to consult with your mechanic about your vehicles condition on a regular basis.

## Dear Motor Medics,

My questions about wipers on both the front and rear of my vehicle. I have a 2004 Chrysler Town and Country and the front wipers have stopped working three years in a row now in mid-winter requiring replacing the wiper motor each time and the rear wiper never seems to wipe the glass completely. The blade has been replaced at least three times and it only works for a few weeks before it starts wiping poorly in the center.

**Jack in Windom Minnesota** 

Because of the time the wiper motor is failing I suspect it may be due to the load of ice on the blades. Winter is brutal on wiper systems. It is extremely important that before you turn your wipers on you make sure that they are not stuck to the glass or bound by heavy snow. Clear the glass with a window scraper if necessary and lift the blades by hand to check them. It they are restrained in any way the motor will bear the load and may fail immediately. If you have a remote starter don't forget to turn off the wipers before you get out of the vehicle. Many people damage the system by forgetting them and when the vehicle starts so do the frozen wipers. As for the rear blade it may be the arm. The arm will lose tension as it ages and won't keep the blade in contact with the glass.



## From A1 School Board

Manager, presented the board with a breakdown of how each dollar in the district is spent. Most of each dollar, 58 cents, goes to pay for teachers, paraprofessionals, substitutes and to purchase classroom materials. Business operations was the next largest slice which takes 19 cents of every dollar. That includes building operations, transportation, staff, utilities, fuel, supplies, repairs, service, and insurance. The school administration takes 11 cents of each dollar to pay for the superintendent, principals, activities director, secretaries, audits, and legal and supply costs. Student instruction support services (8 cents) and co-curricular activities (4 cents), such as coaches, travel, officials and supplies took up the rest.

The school district enrollment was down this year. For budgeting purposes the district must make a best guess as to what enrollment number will be. The estimated number was 1,380 students with the actual number being 1,343. This is important since the state of South Dakota uses a formula to calculate how much revenue they send to the district per student.

"This equates to \$229,000 we are short for our budget," Willard said.

Proefrock says that the district has a contingency fund for this and the capital outlay fund can also help with that budget shortfall. Willard says the district is not too concerned at this point but whether we have a cold or mild winter might affect things later in the year.

What might change in the future is how student enrollment is figured. Currently the state asks each district to submit enrollment figures for the fourth Thursday of September.

"Since then we've gained 10 kids this year, but we can't count them," Willard said.

The state used to use an Average Daily Member formula. At the end of the school year each district would take an average of what their daily enrollment was and submit that. Willard said the disadvantage of that mechanism was the delay in funding. A district would not receive their funding until the following school year. With the current process the funding is provided during the school year in which enrollment is submitted.

"But it's frustrating when you have a count on that day and the following day you have a family of five moving into the district," Willard said. "We still have to take care of them, but there is no funding for them."

# Looking Back in Belle-

From the Belle Fourche Bee 60th Anniversary Edition, June 6, 1951

Livestock – Backbone of the

Tri-State Region Belle Leaps To Prominence In Early Days With Record Shattering Cattle Shipments Mention names like the VVV and Cross Anchor in Belle Fourche today and the odds are three to one you'll draw a blank look. Those names that helped to skyrocket Belle Fourche to

prominence in the livestock

world rapidly are becoming

mere words in history books. The 60 years since Belle Fourche was born has seen many changes in the cattle industry, and even in the cattle. The rugged, rangy Texas longhorn has disappeared. In its place in the short, stocky Hereford. Where ranchers counted their stock in thousands, even the big ranchers today count their cattle in hundreds.

Cattlemen today talk fluently of vaccines and a multitude of treatments that were unheard of in the romantic period of the gun toting cowboy. Thru all these years and changes, however, the livestock industry, both sheep and cattle, has been the backbone of Belle Fourche. While farming and more recently sugar and bentonite, have contributed substantially to the progress of the town, the livestock industry still forms the basis of Belle Fourche econo-

To Prominence Overnight Belle Fourche roared to prominence as a cowtown almost overnight. The railroad reached Belle in 1890. That year, 1615 carloads of cattle - 20 to the car - were shipped. Freight on the shipments amounted to \$200,000. The cattle - \$50 stuff

- was valued at \$1,615,000. By 1902 Belle Fourche had become known as the greatest original cattle shipping point in the world. That year 110,000 head of cattle. That year 110,000 head of cattle, valued at \$6,000,000, went out of Belle. That figure has never since been approached.

Sheep Offset Drop in Cattle However, since that time, sheep have come to play a more prominent part in the area's economy. As the number of cattle have decreased, the number of sheep has increased. In 1950, 42,498 head of cattle were handled thru the Belle Fourche Exchange. Some cattle were shipped directly to central markets, some went thru other exchanges in the area, out for the most part that will give you some idea of the size of the cattle industry today. Last year saw, however, 52,894 head of sheep, 8863 hogs and 653 horses sold here – a total of 104,908 head of livestock valued at \$8,479,801 sold at the local exchange.

Cattle Before Belle The cattle business was flourishing in eastern Wyoming and southeastern Montana long before Seth Bullock maneuvered the railroad to Belle Fourche. However, ranching in the immediate vicinity was not born until gold was discovered in the Black Hills. Records show the first herd of cattle was turned loose on the Centennial prairie near what is now Spearfish in 1876. Later that year, M. V. Boughton drove in 200 head, which he grazed on lower Falsebottom. He lost those cattle. A band of Sioux them off. During the spring of 1877, however, the first big herd was trailed from Texas. There were several thousand cattle in the bunch and they ranged on the Redwater and tributary streams. Several small

herds came in that year, ranging along the Redwater, Spearfish and Belle Fourche. In 1880, several large companies drove their herds to this area. Among them, the Driskill Brothers, the E6 and Cross Anchor. However, in 1879 and 1880, settlement of the Falsebottom, Redwater and Spearfish valleys forced the cattlemen to move their herds farther from the Black Hills. They pushed out along the Belle Fourche.

The period from 1880 to 1906 was the day of the big cattle outfits in the Tri-State area - looked upon today as the romantic period in the country's development. Range talk of the day included names like the Flying V, the Hat, Turkey Track, Mill Iron, Hash Knife and VVV.

Thousands Die in Blizzard Few old time cattlemen recall those days, however, without remembering the winter of 1886-87. A blizzard swept the ranges, covering the grass with a deep blanket of snow. Cattle died by the thousands. The E6, for instance, (belongs to Clark, Plumb and Company and located on the South Grand in Harding county) went into the winter with 18,000 cattle and





counted out 1900 in the spring round-up. Out of the 10,000 that were trailed from Texas in the summer of '86, only 20 were alive the next year.

The small farmer and rancher kept moving out from the Black Hills and by 1904, records of the day list the VVV as the largest cattle outfit in the immediate vicinity. Here is how one writer described the change in 1903. "Last summer this writer visited the range section which he had first seen in 1888. He found the country fenced and cultivated. Farm houses stood where formerly cattle ranged; in each enclosure were numerous heads of cattle, in fact there were five times as there were in 1888. In the early days one man owned 10,000 head of cattle today 100 men own 100 head of cattle each. The disappearance of the large herds has benefited the country.'



As an example, if a community sends \$10K away, that is between \$30K and \$70K that will no longer be taxable and is lost to community forever. The city and taxpayer are

both losers in this scenario. Make no mistake, these types of things happen across the country quite often in many communities with leaders rarely stopping to think of the local ramifications of their actions. However, as I shared with a reader who wrote in, these types of situations, while hurtful to the community in the short-term, can be used to make lemonade out of the lemons they have been given.

Thus, the title of this week's column, never, never give up. Leaders, media, business owners and others need to take these examples and use them as educational opportunities for the entire community. It is a great







# Local woman spins her yarn

NEWELL-There's probably nothing more wonderful than the soft, velvetlike wool from an Angora rabbit. It can be spun into yarn to create just about anything imaginable. Lisa Wonderly, Newell, can transform not only Angora rabbit wool, but 30-40 different wools, fibers, silks, and plant-based fibers into amazing pieces of art. As a Fiber Artist, Hand Spinner, and Crochet Artist, Lisa does a lot of custom work. She specializes in wearables and "cuddles" for all sizes and is most noted for her blended rolags (roll of fiber

for hand spinning into yarn). Lisa started a small rabbitry called Creative Ripples Rabbitry about three years ago. At first, she raised pedigreed French Angoras, then became a registered rabbitry in the ARBA the beginning of 2019. She has worked with the South Dakota Sheep Grower's Association to do educational talks before COVID-19, and still uses social media to show and teach people about the many different fiber animals. She is very passionate to help teach on the subject and loves to visit with local shep-

Star of the rabbit herd is Itty Bitty, one of Lisa's second-generation French Angora rabbits. She is an example of the fine wool of the French Angora, according to Wonderly. Most French Angoras have a "plucking gene" so that their wool will become loose about every three to four months and can be plucked out and then spun to form a soft luxurious yarn. Angora wool is seven times warmer than sheep's wool, making it the warmest and softest known wool. It is considered a luxury fiber.

Not only does Lisa spin and crochet her pieces, but she also dyes the fibers using a commercial dye with vinegar as the acid carrier. An interesting note is that she can take wool from two different sheep within the

same herd and have the color of the wool be a different shade. That's part of the excitement, she says, of working with fiber. Each type of wool is like a brand-new canvas, she said.

Spinning the fiber puts Wonderly into a Zen-like mood. The calmness of working her foot and holding the fiber is very calming and she loses track of time. She said that spinning makes her feel like she's "spinning the wool into gold" since she can take something that seems like nothing and turn it into a beautiful product.

Although Lisa began taking Christmas orders in April, she does have many pieces available that are for sale. The creations can be found on her website-Creativeripplesbylisa. com. She is also found on Facebook, Instagram, and TicToc.

"I know I'm doing what I'm meant to do," she said.

Her goal is to find studio space for a fiber art studio. The future is wide open with many possibilities for this young enthusiastic fiber artist.

"I went into teaching because I wanted to help children be successful in their education and life goals," said Heiser. "As a freshman, I learned I had


a learning disability and was struggling as a student. I had an amazing math teacher who made it her goal to work with me daily to help me succeed and flourish in school. That

# Then and Now in Newell

November 2, 1911
Steps are being taken to organize a fire Department in town. The members will be relieved from paying a Poll Tax, exempt from Jury Duty and receive half a cartwheel every time he attends a fire. The City Dads are building a structure on the northeast corner of the park to house the chemical engine.

November 3, 1921 Rev. Father Arthur Belknap of Lead was murdered early on Wednesday morning of last week and Andrew Rolando is being sought by the authorities in connection with the shooting. An unknown man came to the apartments of the Priest and requested him to go to the bedside of a man who was supposed to be dying and the Priest finding his car disabled, started on foot to the place in Poorman Gulch where he met his death. Father Belknap was well known throughout the Black Hills country and feeling runs very high as the result of this most foul shooting. Father Henry Klein of the local Catholic Church was a classmate of Father Belknap and took part in the funeral services held in Lead Saturday of last week.

As Mr. Smith and Miss Blakely were returning from Deadwood Saturday afternoon, the car dropped off the culvert on the east line of the Anderson farm. With the assistance of W.F. Long, the car was pushed out and they went on their way rejoicing. Mr. Smith was accused of driving with only one hand on the wheel, but says "nothing doing".

November 5, 1931

In accordance with an order from the state Game & Fish Commission, Butte County will

have a short open season on pheasants due to the birds thriving in Butte County. According to the official notice published, the season will be open for 3 half days, November 8, 10 & 12 from noon to sunset on those days, but only within that portion of Butte County lying east of US Highway 85 and south of the South Fork of the Moreau River. Hunters are limited to the killing of not to exceed 2 male birds on each day and no person shall have in his possession at anytime more than 4 male birds.

The contractor in charge of the work of building a new concrete bridge across Willow Creek on state Highway 79, north of Newell, arrived on the job recently. Bob Guindon with M.E. Hafner's "Big Cat" is on the job moving dirt which will be necessary as a result of the decision to straighten out the bad curve on that stretch.

November 6, 1941


