## Fiberglass Tank Plant Closing

**BELLE FOURCHE** - Design Tanks, a Sioux Falls company, has been operating a fiberglass tank manufacturing facility 3 miles north of Belle Fourche on US Hwy 85 just south of the BF airport.

Design Tanks who was producing fiberglass tanks for the agricultural and chemical industries has been leasing the facility since February of 2016. An internal management decision was made not to renew their lease for Black Hills Fiberglass facility.

Employees are finishing up tank production and will begin the process of cleaning up and closing. The Design Tanks lease ends October 31.

Black Hills Fiberglass, a group of mostly South Dakota investors, built the facility in 2012 to meet the growing demand for tanks in the booming oil field market in North Dakota, Montana, and Wyoming. Since 2012 the facility had employed between ten and twenty employees. The last several months that number had been cut to less than 10. Current Manager Travis Henson is assigned the task of concluding operations.

Black Hills Fiberglass suspended operation in 2015 and sold the fiberglass production equipment to Design Tanks and subsequently entered into a lease agreement for the land and buildings. Design Tanks will move the Belle Fourche tank production to their Sioux Falls facility. Design Tanks, Sioux

**COLO SPRINGS, CO.** - The Black Hills Roundup continues to be recognized. In addition to this summer's induction of the Roundup into the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame they are one of five rodeos nominated for the PRCA's "Medium Rodeo of the Year". Other rodeos nominated were Amarillo, Texas; Coleman, Texas; Estes Park, Colorado; and Stephenville, Texas. Balloting takes place in October for voting PRCA members and the winner will be announced at the Annual PRCA Awards Banquet at the South Point in Las Vegas December 5th before the start of this year's Wrangler National Finals Rodeo (Dec. 6-15).

In addition to Belle Fourche's nomination for Medium Rodeo Roundup perennial stock contractor Powder River Rodeo, Riverton, Wyo, is up for "Stock

Contracting Firm of the Year." Powder River has provided the vast majority of the bucking stock for the Roundup for the past 30 years.

Falls, then under the ownership and management of the late Tom Huegel, was started when it purchased the fiberglass division of Raven Industries.

The fiberglass equipment currently in the plant has been sold to KBK Industries, a Kansas fi-

berglass tank manufacturer and will be dismantled and removed before the end of October. Black Hills Fiberglass plans to put the 16,000 square foot production facility and 10 acre site up for sale.

## State HS Finals Rodeo To Move to Ft. Pierre in '20

**PIERRE** - At the State High School Rodeo Association annual meeting in Pierre last Saturday evening it was decided to award the 2020 and 2021 State High School Finals Rodeo to Ft. Pierre.

The 2019 high school finals this coming summer will be held in Belle Fourche from June 12 -15, 2019.

Sites for the event will be let out for bids on a two-year basis with Belle Fourche's next opportunity to host coming in June of 2022.

## County Tax Certificate Sale Sees Few Takers

**BELLE FOURCHE** - Butte County commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2018-18 in July of this year allowing the County to waive the prohibition in South Dakota law against the selling of tax certificates. The resolution further directed the Butte County Treasurer to begin the selling of those tax certificates. The process began on September 1, 2018 at the Treasurer's office.

The amount of delinquent taxes owing on July 31st of this year was \$689,018.78. The fact that tax certificates were to be sold apparently presented some incentive to the taxpayer and as a result by September 21st \$89,689.28 of delinquent taxes were paid in.

This action was a first for Butte County and few knew what the response would be at the time of the sale. The certificates were offered on a "first come, first served basis." In the past there has been some resistance to such an effort by governments in other parts of the country. Butte County Sheriff Fred Lamphere was on hand in the unlikely event that such reaction would occur in Belle Fourche.

The end of the first day of the tax certificates being for sale to private individuals netted one certificate being sold for a total amount of \$923.74. The second, and thus far only other tax certificate sold was on September 7 in the amount of \$4,064.02. The end result is there is still a total unpaid amount in Butte County of \$547,780.29.

The law reads: "If any person intends to purchase the interest of the county in the tax certificate acquired by the treasurer

## TAX SALE

for the county, the person may pay to the treasurer the amount of the taxes, penalty, interest, and costs of sale and transfer and all unpaid or subsequent taxes as specified in § 10-23-27. The treasurer shall issue a tax receipt for the taxes, penalty, interest, and costs. The treasurer shall assign and deliver to the purchaser the tax certificate of purchase held by the county for

the real property, which assignment and transfer shall convey unto the purchaser all the rights of the county in the tax certificate as much as if the person was the original purchaser at the tax certificate sale.”The maximum interest the person may charge the property owner is set by law at 10%.

Only certified funds will be accepted to purchase a tax certificate. The treasurer’s office is only selling the tax certificate.

There is a legal process that the purchaser must follow in order to take deed to the property. The County recommends that the purchaser seek legal counsel before they purchase a certificate.

It is the county’s intention to continue this practice and any additional taxes that become delinquent on December 1, 2018 will be added to the list of tax certificates for sale.

## Pastor’s Perspective

*This week’s Pastor’s Perspective is provided by Stephen Carson, from Belle Fourche Connection Church.*

### The Lord Our Shepherd

There are many different ways that God is described in the bible. One of my favorites, though, is the description of God as our shepherd. Aside from John 3:16, perhaps the most well known passage in all of the scriptures may very well be Psalm 23. It is a beautiful, intimate portrait of the Good Shepherd! As a person studies Psalm 23 there are two key verses to understanding this psalm. They are verses 1 and 4. In verse 1 we read, “The Lord is my Shepherd.” The word “my” is so important! It speaks of personal relationship. The rest of this psalm flows out of this personal knowledge and relationship that David has with his the Shepherd. The other key verse is verse 4. It reads, “Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.” Tucked away near the middle of this verse and psalm is the word, “you.” David, when writing this psalm, was fully aware that God’s presence with him was the secret to walking through the “valleys of the shadow of death” with peace.



Some scholars believe that David was writing this psalm as a young shepherd as he was tending his sheep. Others believe that he was much older and experienced in life. I tend to believe that the latter is true. It seems like as David is writing this psalm he is reflecting on his life and his relationship with the Shepherd, his Lord, who had been so faithful to him throughout all of his days. As David recalls the “valley of the shadow of death,” I imagine him remembering all of the trials and tribulations that he had endured. I imagine him remembering the pain that he brought on himself and others by his sin and bad choices. But, through all of those valleys, God had been with him and had been so faithful to him.

As you read this psalm let me encourage you with some of the truths from each verse;

- Verse 1: If the Lord is your Shepherd, then He is your fulfillment.
- Verse 2: If the Lord is your Shepherd, then He is your provider.
- Verse 3: If the Lord is your Shepherd, then He is your righteousness.
- Verse 4: If the Lord is your Shepherd, then He is your comfort.
- Verse 5: If the Lord is your Shepherd, then He is your protector.
- Verse 6: If the Lord is your Shepherd, then He is yours forever.

I hope this psalm encourages you as much as it does me! If you don’t know the Good Shepherd, come to trust Him! Yield your life to Him. Trust in Jesus and what He did on the cross for you in your place. Be made new through Christ. If you know Him, then in the good times and in the valleys, trust Him and seek Him. For He is good!

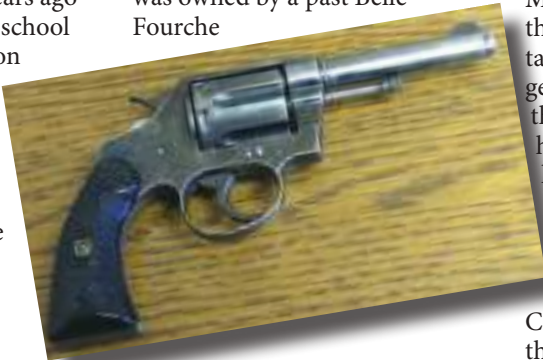

As you might expect Bartmann points out that it takes a lot of time and effort to change opinions and the way a community may feel about itself but it is possible. “Once you change those

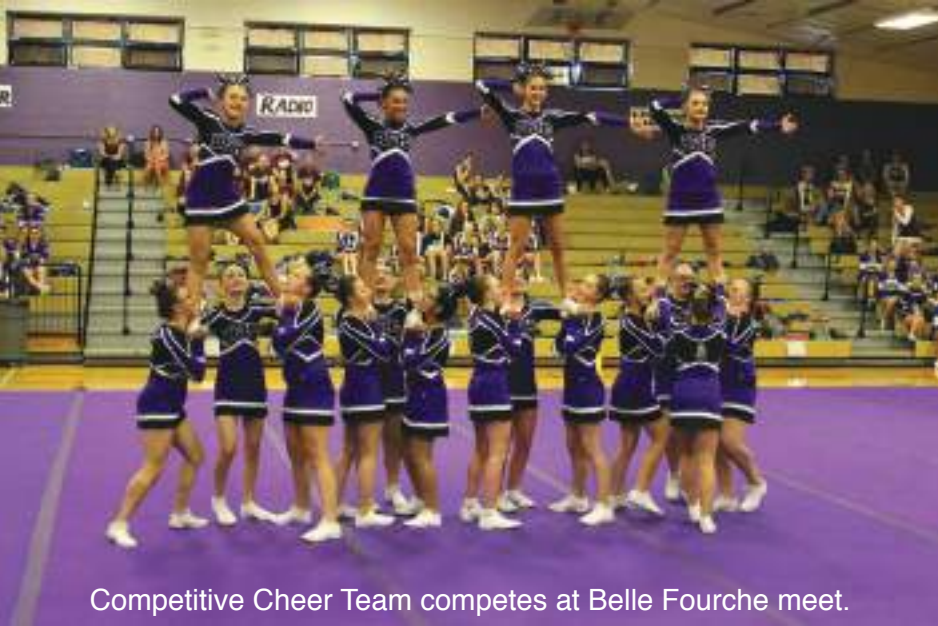

attitudes, it unlocks real possibilities for progress," Bartmann says.

The project began with a two-day brainstorming and collaboration session in January where small task groups were formed and a series of listening sessions within the Belle Fourche community were begun. In fact, during that meeting it was mentioned that the community needed to re-establish its own

newspaper. Already the program has seen progress and has collected a huge amount of information, according to Stalder.

Working livestock, shearing, preg testing, milking, raising calves or lambs, haying and raising feed was as natural as breathing. Josh graduated from Newell High School, and Heather from Bonesteel. They met at SDSU and they were married in June of 2012. They purchased a place north of Nisland. They have re-built fences, corrals, laid new water lines, installed an irrigation pivot, and built a lambing barn. They practice soil health with crop rotation, the use of cover crops and cattle and sheep grazing. They raise purebred Registered SAMM sheep, a wool and meat breed along with a few cattle. They imported their sheep genetics from Australia and provide complete production and loin eye data to their customers through the National Sheep Improvement Program. They have sold breeding their stock across the country. They are members of the South Dakota Sheep Growers, Wyoming Sheep Growers and Mountain State Lamb Cooperative. They have a boy just about 4 years old and a girl that just turned 2 with another on the

way! They will be taking over his parents’ operation in a farm and ranch operation in the next 4 years. Continuing to improve the land and animals are important, passing on the love of agriculture to the next generation is a loving priority.
